

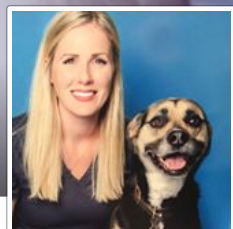

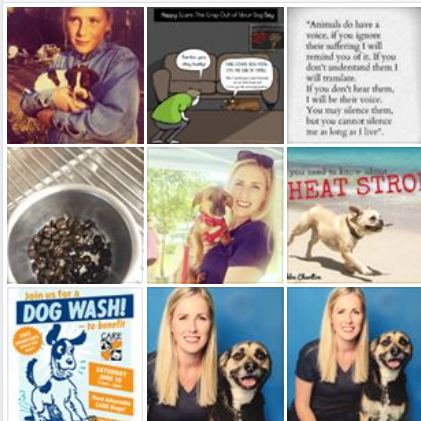

UPDATE: this is the FDA report that I referenced in my original post.

This report confirmed Fanconi-Like Syndrome. The FDA defined Canine Carry Outs in the jerky category. They recommended removal of these treats.

I believe Canine Carry Outs (beef flavor) POISONED one of my patients.

One of my canine patients was fed these treats every day for a year, and developed Fanconi-Like Syndrome because of it. It nearly cost him his life.

This is the same syndrome we have been seeing caused by the chicken jerky treats that originated in China (American chicken jerky treats have since been shown to cause disease now too).

Signs of Fanconi-Like Syndrome caused by poisonous treats include drinking and urinating more frequently, vomiting, lethargy, and crying out as if in pain. If you notice any of these signs in your pet, please call your veterinarian.
